This position helps ensure transfer students have a successful and seamless path when transferring from CVTC to one of the three participating UW schools. FR 2.6: Best Practices in Articulation Agreement Creation

This session will discuss best practices in drafting articulation agreements, using the experience of Moraine Park Technical College and University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's recent partnership in a grant-funded project that resulted in the formalizing of 49 agreements focused largely on STEM pathways. Using an innovative approach to program-to-program articulation, the two schools formed collaborative teams of academic leaders and faculty to develop relationships and strengthen understanding of each other's curricula and pedagogy. This session will review the structure of the partnership, criteria for determining the efficacy of a given agreement, lessons learned, questions raised, and challenges ahead.
