Students waiting,/ up and down the academic halls,/ their shadows searching on START days,/ Schedules, people!/ Livin' to find the right classes/ Hiding, somewhere in Planner. But those students won't be waiting if they get the right pre-registered courses ahead of time. Prerequisites, placement scores, conflicts with athletics, music, and other responsibilities, and most especially, having enough seats in the right classes - the struggle is real. At the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, our START (STudent Advising Registration and Transition) program brings together many areas of campus to get first years off on the right footing. The Records and Registration Office plays a vital part by organizing a pre-registration process to place students in a certain number of credits (core courses) before they arrive on campus for their START day. Also, before, during, and after START, the office controls capacities and provides registration and enrollment management support, including planning around missing scores and transfer/AP credit and spreading avail able seats across all 9-10 days of the event. Come hear a breakdown of how the magic happens!



She received a bachelor of science in nursing from Illinois Wesleyan University in 1986, a master of science in psychiatric nursing from the University of Illinois at Chicago in 1989 and a Ph.D. in nursing with a concentration in research methodology from Saint Louis University in 2002.
