State Education Benefits

- ❖ Wisconsin Tuition Reimbursement Grant: (dma.wi.gov/DMA/support/education)
 - ❖ Tuition reimbursement up to 8 semesters, up to UW-Madison rate (approx. \$4,700)
 - ❖ Wisconsin schools or schools with reciprocity with Wisconsin
 - ❖ Wisconsin DMA Form 189 completed by student and turned into campus VA Rep. within 90 days of end of semester
 - ❖ Soldier pays tuition upfront
 - ❖ Reimbursement at end of semester
 - ❖ Enlisted and Warrants only
 - ❖ Only good towards first bachelors
 - ❖ Can only use while serving in the NG

State Education Benefits

- ❖ **Wisconsin State GI Bill** (*WisVets.com or 1-800-WIS-VETS (947-8387)*)
 - ❖ 128 credits towards tuition waived at UW or Wis. Tech. College System
 - ❖ Must have been a resident of Wisconsin during AIT, BOLC, AD, or Deployment, or a resident of WI for 5 years after qualifying service (DD214)
 - ❖ Can use during and after military service
 - ❖ Must exhaust Post 9/11 GI Bill (can combine)
 - ❖ Use for any degree... Bachelors, Masters, Doctorate
 - ❖ Most commonly used benefit by officers, 2nd most commonly used by enlisted
 - ❖ ***Dependents of qualifying service members with 30%+ service connected disability also qualify ***

State Education Benefits

- ❖ **Wisconsin Veteran Student Assistance Grant** (*WisVets.com or 1-800-WIS-VETS (947-8387)*)
 - ❖ \$2,000 grant up to 8 semesters/128 credits for eligible veterans at many private nonprofit schools in Wisconsin.
 - ❖ Same eligibility rules of Wisconsin GI Bill apply
 - ❖ New as of November 2020

Federal Education Benefits

❖ Chapter 1606 Select Reserve

- ❖ 2021/22 rate: \$397 per full month (*pro-rated*)
- ❖ You may have an additional kicker of \$200 or \$350
- ❖ “Pocket money” to use for books, housing, food, etc.
- ❖ Apply at va.gov to get eligibility letter
- ❖ Send denial letters to our office to assist with correcting (ngwi.edu@mail.mil)
- ❖ Give eligibility letter to VA rep on college campus
- ❖ Most commonly used federal benefit by National Guard troops
- ❖ Combine this federal benefit with either state benefits or Federal Tuition Assistance (*FTA*)

Federal Education Benefits

- ◆ **Federal Tuition Assistance (FTA)** www.ArmyIgnitEd.com
 - ❖ 16 semester hours (SH) /\$250 per SH/up to \$4,000 /per fiscal year
 - ❖ Effective May 4, 2021, service members enrolled in a half-time or more program of study may now receive the Federal Tuition Assistance (FTA) and Chapter 1606 Montgomery GI Bill – Select Reserve (MGIB-SR) benefits simultaneously for the same course.
 - ❖ You must be very proactive. Create a ArmyIgnitEd.com account and have supporting documentation uploaded and approved before the start of the course
 - ❖ Why use FTA:
 - Out of state or online school that doesn't qualify for the Wisconsin Grant or Wisconsin GI Bill. Have used up other benefits

Federal Education Benefits

❖ Chapter 33 Post 9/11 GI Bill (www.va.gov)

- ❖ Up to 100% of in-state tuition
- ❖ Up to \$25K for foreign or private schools
- ❖ Up to \$1,000 book/supply stipend
- ❖ Monthly housing allowance
 - BAH rate E-5 w/ dependents
 - BAH determined by ZIP code of school
 - \$916.60 for online courses
- ❖ You can transfer this to dependents
- ❖ You can combine Post 9/11 GI Bill with FTA, Tuition Grant, or WI GI Bill to cover any remaining cost if your Post 9/11 GI Bill is not 100%

Post 9/11 Qualifying Service Time (Cumulative time)	
At least 36 months, or purple heart recipient	100%
30 months	90%
24 months	80%
18 months	70%
6 months	60%
90 days	50%

Chapter 33 Post 9/11

❖ Percentage Explained

- ❖ Tuition paid to school
- ❖ Housing stipend (BAH E5 w/ Dependents) paid to you
- ❖ \$1,000 book stipend paid to you
- ❖ If you have less than 100% you may combine with another benefit to cover full tuition.
- ❖ Qualifying private schools can use Post 9/11, Tuition Grant, and FTA all together (*Concordia, Alverno, Marquette, etc.*)

Federal Education Benefits

- ❖ Transfer of Education Benefits (TEB) (www.milconnect.com)
 - ❖ Transfer of education benefits is a retention tool.
 - ❖ Service member must have at least six total years of service.
 - ❖ Service member commits to a four year service obligation beginning on the day of the initial transfer.
 - ❖ A service member who transfers benefits does not forfeit their own future eligibility to use Post 9/11.
 - ❖ The service member can transfer the benefits back to themselves at any time and move between recipients.
 - ❖ Post 9/11 GI Bill is the only education benefit eligible to transfer.

Federal Benefits – 48 month rule

48 month rule

- ◇ The two most common Federal GI BILL benefits are Chapter 1606 Select Reserve for National Guard Service and Chapter 33 Post 9/11 GI BILL for Active Duty Service
- ◇ Types of GI BILLS: Chapter 1606, 1607, 30, 33, 35
- ◇ If you have eligibility for more than one GI BILL remember that you can have up to **36 months** of any one program, but only 48 months total combined of all GI BILL programs
- ◇ Example:
 - ◇ 12 months of Chapter 1606 and 36 months of Post 9/11 GI BILL
- ◇ Note: The Wisconsin State GI BILL is not part of this 48 month rule... it's just terribly named.

Apprenticeship Programs/Certifications

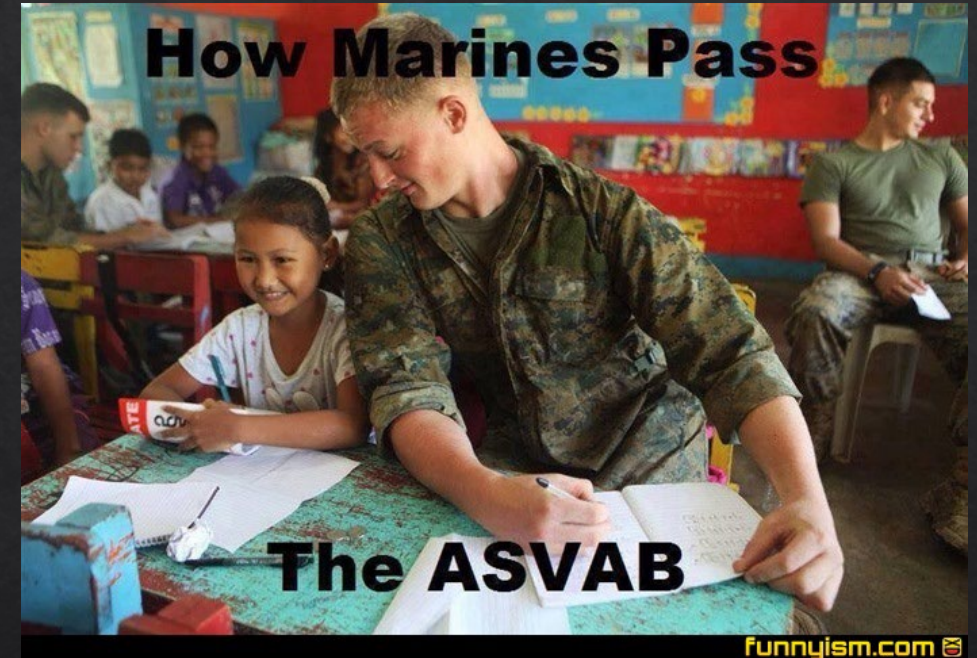
- ◆ Federal GI BILLS (even 1606) can be used to supplement your income during your five-year apprenticeship program.
- ◆ If the union does not pay and you pay tuition at a qualifying school, you could be reimbursed with the Wisconsin Tuition Reimbursement Grant.
- ◆ The GI Bill covers more than just tuition. You can use part of your entitlement to cover the cost of certain tests you need to take to become a licensed or certified professional—or to apply for college or a training course.
 - ❖ Home inspector, relator, personal trainer and many more.

Credentialing Assistance – Army COOL

- ◆ Credentialing Assistance (CA) (www.ArmyIgnitEd.com)
- ◆ Up to \$4,000 per FY toward eligible credentials
- ◆ Examples: Private Pilots License, Home Inspector, EMT, Cross Fit Trainer, Respiratory Therapist, Project Management, Public Affairs Accreditation, Logistics Technician, Information Technology, Adobe Certified Expert...
- ◆ Funding towards classroom, training, books, fees, testing, certification
- ◆ No service obligation for enlisted or officers (new as of 2022)
