

How it Works and Why

 When a veteran enrolls into an apprenticeship program in Wisconsin there is two certifying bodies. This does not apply to unions and other facilities that offer "in house" training.

What Type of Training is it?

☐ Registered Apprenticeship Program

- Not less than 4,000 hours of full-time work experience
- Recommended minimum of 144 hours of related instruction annually

☐ On-the-Job Training Program

- Not less than six months or more than two years
- Related instruction not required


